

**5TH InASEA CONFERENCE “MIGRATIONS IN,
FROM, AND TO SOUTHEASTERN EUROPE:
SOCIAL CHANGES, INTERCULTURAL COMMUNICATION,
TRANSNATIONAL TIES”,
ANKARA, TURKEY, 21-24 MAY 2009**

У Анкари, у Турској од 21. до 24. маја 2009. године одржана је пета међународна конференција удружења антрополога за југоисточну Европу. Конференција је била посвећена теми „Миграције у, из, и у југоисточној Европи: социјалне промене, интеркултурна комуникација, транснационалне везе“. Покровитељи конференције били су Фонд за промоцију турског премијера, Хачетепе Универзитет у Анкари, Венер-Грин фондација за антрополошка истраживања (Wenner-Gren Foundation for Anthropological Research), Немачка фондација за истраживање (Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG), Универзитетска агенција за франкофонију (Agence Universitaire de la Francophonie).

Пета конференција InASEA одржана је у простору Хачетепе Универзитета (Hacettepe University), у салама за конференције са савременом техничком опремом за визуелне презентације тако да су излагања била усмерена и на визуелно представљање проблематике. Потешкоћу и проблем на овако комплексним и великим конференцијама представља веома густ програм тако да се није могло у исто време присуствовати на више сесија и панел-дискусија. Стога су учесници само делимично могли добити представу о расправама које су се водиле на панелима јер су често били у немогућности да испрате дискусије које су следиле након излагања.

После пленарне седнице на отварању конференције и излагања проф. др Леа Лукасена (Lucassen, Leo), проф. др Јасне Чапо Жмегач, проф. др Абадан Унат Нермина (Prof. PhD. Abadan Unat, Nermin), рад се одвијао у осам сесија с панелима. Током тродневног рада саопштено је око 110 реферата.

Политичке, културне, економске, верске, еколошке, демографске, медицинске и војне кризе изгледа да све више дефинишу начин живота у 21. веку. Покретљивост становништва како у прошлости тако и данас у новом комплекснијем дискурсу заокупљају пажњу антрополога, историчара, социолога јер се и они сами у улози истраживача суочавају с различитим кризним моментима и мобилности становништва у њиховим срединама.

У фокусу су биле теме посвећене миграцијама у следећем дискурсу: *Историјски аспект емиграције и сезонске миграције у југоисточној Европи у модерном добу; Род и миграције; Миграције и интеркултурално комуницирање; Медији, нове технологије и (Пост) модерни досељеници; Досељеничка искустава и реакције на (културна, економска и социјална) укључивања и искључивања; Успостављање новог дома: „адаптација“ и „традиција“ између могућности и ограничења; Перцепција и представљање балканских миграната на Западу; Дијаспоре, национализам и политичка мобилизација миграната; Транснационалне (културне, друштвене, економске и политичке) везе у прошлости и садашњости; Повратак миграната као културни иноватори или осавремењивачи прилика? Социјалне и културне димензије домаћих миграција; Присилне миграције и културне димензије; Режији и политичке емиграције и имиграције у југоисточној Европи; „Нови“ имигранати у југоисточној Европи (дипломате, менаџери, саветници, академици, пензионери, избеглице Трећег света, итд); Миграције као процес: доношење одлука, породичне стратегије, планови за будућност; „Недозвољене“ или миграције без документа; Миграције и индивидуално, колективно и културно сећање миграната; Концепти, методологије и контроверзе актуелних истраживања миграција.*

Учесници из Србије су били: др Весна Вучинић-Нешковић, ванредни професор и доц. др Илдико Ердеи, Катедра за етнологију и антропологију Филозофског факултета у Београду, мр Александар Р. Милетић, мр Весна Ђикановић и мр Ивана Добривојевић са Института за савремену историју Србије, Београд; др Весна Марјановић из Етнографског музеја у Београду.

У приказу ћу само у основним назнакама представити етнолошко-антрополошке теме о миграцијама чији су излагачи биле И. Ердеи, В. Вучинић-Нешковић и В. Марјановић.

Илдико Ердеи у њеном излагању *‘Should They Stay or Should They Go’ – Migration, Social Imagination and Family Strategies in Contemporary Serbia*, разматра проблем како савремене породице које припадају средњој класи дају подршку, планирају и помажу својој деци да организују боравак, често трајни у иностранству, а све у циљу да млади остваре боље услове живота и како све ово постаје део породичне стратегије (углавном средње класе) ради остварења замисли о бољем животу, и стварања бољих услова за следећу генерацију у процесу социјалне и културне трансформације постсоцијалистичке Србије.

Весна Вучинић-Нешковић се у њеном излагању *Repatriate Entrepreneurship in Serbia: A Study on the Business Culture of Hausmajstor* бави про-

блематиком развоја „хаузмајстора“, тј. „домара“ – мале фирме за одржавање некретнина, чији је оснивач српски повратник из Аустрије, 2004. године. Усредсређено на постојеће организационе и пословне односе дате културе, излагање доноси опис и анализу интеркултуралног искуства „хаузмајстора“ који су у сопственој култури фокусирани на три главна питања: (1) реакцији на запослење у фирми у којој су постављене идеје и вредности изграђене на искуству стеченом на раду у иностранству, (2) перцепцији првих контаката и успостављању односа стечених на Западу, и (3) реакцији на могућност да аустријске фирме постану најпре као потенцијални, а касније као стварни партнер.

Весна Марјановић је у свом излагању *Croats In Middle Banat – One Example of Keeping Live Memory of Homeland for over two Centuries* расправљала о посебној групи Хрвата кајкаваца који су се населили у средњи Банат почетком 19. века и њиховом механизму очувања и креирања сећања на стари завичај, Туропоље, преко два века.

У целини, из приложених тема и програма конференције уочава се веома сложена проблематика која спаја историјске, антрополошке, социолошке, политичке, економске и културолошке анализе феномена миграција. Међутим, показало се да већину стручњака који се баве овим проблемима у друштву на ширем и локалном плану, углавном заокупљају савремени процеси миграција, узроци, преносиви обрасци и интеграције миграната у нове културне моделе земаља у које долазе. Осим тога у жижи расправе били су и повратници који се враћају у завичај с амбивалентним односом према сопственој култури настојећи да евидентну крутност друштва покрену и пробуде према обрасцу западних модела.
